



Dawlaty, which means ‘my state’ in Arabic, started life in 2012 in the midst of the Syrian revolution as a platform to develop and share materials for and build capacity of young Syrian activists and the public on subjects relating to democratic transition. Dawlaty registered as a non-profit civil organization in 2013, with the aim of building the capacity of Syrian civil society to participate in and lead democratic transition in Syria, as well as to develop, nurture and consolidate concepts and skills related to non-violent organizing, transitional justice and citizenship.
