



Syrian Institute for Justice was founded in 2011 in Aleppo, Syria by a group of lawyers and academics. The institute's work is focused on human rights, criminal justice and features consultants, forensic experts and criminal evidence. The Institute also monitors and documents human rights violations in Syria from any party, issues periodic reports and prepares legal studies in support of transitional justice in Syria. The Institute also prepares cadres and disseminate human rights culture through programs and rehabilitative training courses. Syrian Institute for Justice, in collaboration with PILPG, had started a project on documenting cases of enforced disappeared in both Idlib and Aleppo Governorate. After being informed of the latest incidents of enforced disappearances in Aleppo, the board of the institute reorganized itself to have stronger focus on these cases. Today, it is monitoring these cases, collecting information by the activists, and then studying and analyzing the data. The activists of the institute have now activated their networks in different areas to reach to reliable sources of information about these cases of disappearances.
